CAPITOL JOURNAL WEEK IN REVIEW

Host Todd Stacy and longtime APT reporters Randy Scott and Jeffrey Sanders covered important Alabama news throughout the year, interviewing newsmakers, lawmakers and a range of experts about important issues facing the state and viewers. *Capitol Journal's* straightforward, unbiased reporting and in-depth coverage offers viewers access to state officials and legislators that is unique on television. *Capitol Journal* is produced in APT's Statehouse Studio on the bottom floor of the Alabama State House, where legislators are just an elevator ride away from the House and Senate chambers.

LEGISLATIVE COVERAGE

Capitol Journal adds nightly coverage of issues and activities in the state capital when the Alabama Legislature is in session. Coverage included a live broadcast of Governor Kay Ivey's the **State of the State** address in February.

ENGAGE: GETTING THE VOTE RIGHT

In this election year special, veteran Alabama TV journalist Pam Huff moderated a conversation between Jonah Minkoff-Zern of Public Citizen and Hans von Spakovsky from the Heritage Foundation exploring issues around voter registration.

SPOTLIGHT ON AGRICULTURE

APT's quarterly agriculture series examines farming and food, research and innovation, rural life and urban connections. In the fall, the series explored Auburn College of Agriculture's "Our Work" film series which gives students a look at job options in agriculture outside the typical or expected career paths. "Alabama Biodiversity" featured state experts showing off the diversity of plants and animal species in Alabama. "Food Safety" examined measures to protect food quality and "Alabama Tomatoes" celebrated local growers around the state.



SPOTLIGHT ON EDUCATION

APT's News team and Education department work together to cover important Alabama Education news in this quarterly series. Guests this year included National School Counselor of the Year Diana Virgil of Dadeville High School; State Superintendent of Education Dr. Eric Mackey; Alabama's 2024 Teacher of the Year, Deborah Stringfellow; Paul Morin, Director of Expanding Learning Possibilities; Jennifer Hatchett, Executive Director or YouthServe; and Ibby Dickson, Co-Founder/President of the Alabama Mentoring Initiative.

MUSIC & THE ARTS

MONOGRAPH

Monograph celebrated its sixth season documenting Alabama's rich tapestry of creative works and artistic endeavors in 2024. Monograph's stories originate as short films that are released digitally on a regular basis during the year, and then broadcast as collections of films built around specific themes. In the fall, Monograph explored the world of independent film with Sidewalk Cinema and profiled Oscar awardwinning editor Paul Rogers. Winter's episode showcased Alabama ceramicists Kyle Miller, Charles Smith and Jennifer Wallace Fields.

SUBCARRIER

APT's original music series *Subcarrier* returned to Saturn nightclub in Birmingham's Avondale neighborhood to capture another season of music for broadcast and digital audiences. Performers in our 7th season this year included a broad variety of bands including Yo La Tengo, Kowloon Walled City, Nulging, Life Guard, Horsegirl, Boris and more.

ALABAMA GOSPEL ROOTS

Gospel singers and musicians from Alabama and around the country appeared every Saturday night on APT in the fifth season of *Alabama Gospel Roots*. Hosted by Tuscaloosa native George W. Stewart, the series continued to share all different kinds of gospel music from soloists, groups, acappella singers and instrumentalists and celebrated its 100th episode.

SPECIALS


DISCOVERING ALABAMA

University of Alabama professor Doug Phillips has been sharing the story of Alabama's natural history and wild places for decades on Alabama Public Television. In the new episode *Tumbling Waters* this year, Phillips invited viewers along as he took a paddling trip along a small section of Alabama's 132,000 miles of rivers and streams. In *Insect Wonders*,

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he explored the incredible diversity, amazing adaptability, and vital contributions of insects to life on earth.

APT Community Service Report 2024

GARDEN PARTY "JULY 4TH" BROADCAST SPECIAL

We celebrated July 4th with a special broadcast edition of our YouTube series *Garden Party* featuring Alabama homesteader, author, cook and entertainer Trace Barnett. Barnett was joined by renowned caterer Kathy G to provide tips for hosting the perfect July 4th party or summer get-together. The menu included summer favorites like tomatoes, corn and watermelon put together in surprising and delicious ways.

FOSTER CARE: AGING OUT

This 60-minute special examined the importance of preparing teens in foster care for successful transitions to independence and adulthood. This is the mission of the Independent Living Program at the Alabama Department of Human Resources.

SALT & PEPPER ROOTS MUSIC: ERIC ESSIX

Birmingham jazz artist Eric Essix performed and talked about his influences – including Jimmy Hendrix, George Benson, and African American Spirituals – in a program recorded at the University of North Alabama in Florence. But, it was the performance of the Beatles on the *Ed Sullivan show* when he was 5, Eric said, that made him want to pick up the guitar.



JSU PARTNERSHIP

APT continued its partnership with Jacksonville State University in 2024, to provide students with hands-on experience in video production to create documentaries on Alabama. Two new documentaries and a concert special premiered on APT in 2024.

DEFENDING FREEDOM: THE ARTHUR SHORES STORY

For more than a decade, attorney Arthur Shores took the fight for equality and justice to the court room, winning many significant cases leading up to the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Barbara Shores, Arthur Shores' daughter, lead the discussion of her father's role in civil rights history.

RIDING THROUGH HISTORY – BARBER MOTORSPORTS

This look at the Barber Vintage Motorsports Museum followed founder George Barber's passion for motorsports, his interest in collecting motorcycles, and the complicated journey that led to the creation of the world's largest motorcycle museum.

BLUEGRASS ON THE RIM 2024

This year's concert featured the soulful melodies of Foggy Hollow Review, the enchanting vocals of Kelli Johnson, the infectious energy of The Steel City Jug Slammers, and a special performance by Kelli Johnson with guest star Megan Mullins.







SPORTS

HIGH SCHOOL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Alabama Public Television again presented live coverage of the **Alabama High School Football and Basketball Championships** this year after introducing the games in 2023 and welcoming thousands of new viewers. This was only the second year the championships have been broadcast statewide and the response was again tremendous. *The AHSAA Super 7 Football Championship*, held Dec. 6-8, 2023, kicked off with the Girls flag football final and continued with Boys Class 1A – 7A finals. The three-day *AHSAA Boys and Girls Basketball Finals* were held Feb. 29 – March 2, 2024. APT's broadcasts made the games accessible everywhere in Alabama so that students, parents and communities could see their teams compete.

ACCC MEN'S AND WOMEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The week following our coverage of the high school basketball championships, APT presented the Alabama Community College Conference men's and women's basketball championships. This was the first time the ACCC championships received statewide coverage.

TRANSPLANT GAMES 2024 OPENING CEREMONY

From July 5 - 10, 2024, the city of Birmingham was home to the world's largest celebration of life, the 2024 Transplant Games of America. Thousands of people from all 50 states and abroad came to the Magic City to unite, honor the families who have given the gift of life and raise awareness of organ, eye, and tissue donation and transplantation. Alabama Public Television presented live coverage of the Transplant Games opening ceremony from Legacy Arena.

STEM

ALABAMA STEM EXPLORERS

This action-packed series features science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) experiments and explorations led by a team of Alabama STEM educators and youth hosts. Episodes feature both STEM demonstrations and spotlights on professionals working in STEM careers right here in Alabama.

ALABAMA SCHOLARS BOWL



Middle school and high school teams from across the state compete for scholarship money in the *Alabama Scholars Bowl*, recorded at APT's Madison Avenue studio in Montgomery. Questions in science, technology, engineering, math and history are provided by National Academic Quiz Tournaments and the competition is certified and operated by the Alabama Scholastic Competition Association (ASCA).

DIY SCIENCE TIME SEASON 3

APT produced a third season of our nationally distributed children's science series **DIY Science Time** in 2024. Hosted by co-creator KevIn Cornell, aka "Mister C", DIY Science Time encourages students and their families to explore science with experiments they can do at home using ordinary household objects.

The program facilitates confidence, encourages critical thinking, and allows students and families to bond while learning together and having fun.

"Each episode is specifically designed so that students, along with their families, can follow along and conduct experiments of their own at home by using ordinary, household objects," says Cornell. "This does more than simply help students learn about STEM topics. The program facilitates confidence, encourages critical thinking and allows students and families to bond while learning together."

IN THE MARGINS

In the Margins is a series that covers the history you may not have learned about in school, exploring obscure, yet captivating tales that offer unique insights into their time and place. Alabama Public Television produced four episodes of the PBS Digital Studios series—exploring Alabama history. The four episodes feature the story of a small Alabama town and its connection to the Chitlin Circuit during the mid-1900s; the history of the Tuskegee VA, the first federal hospital staffed and operated by Black physicians; the significant role of Black banks, such as Birmingham's Penny Savings Bank, in fostering economic empowerment within their communities; and the long-standing struggle for federal recognition of the MOWA Band of Choctaw Indians, a Native American tribe located in southern Alabama. Our In the Margins episodes had 786,948 views on YouTube; 24,655 views on YouTube Shorts and 69,809 Instagram Reel plays.

COMMUNITY EVENTS AND OUTREACH

BE MY NEIGHBOR DAY 2024

APT has hosted in-person *Be My Neighbor Day* family events in several Alabama cities in recent years. *Be My Neighbor Day* invites children 2-8 and their families to participate in volunteer activities that support their neighbors and their community. In addition, it informs children about the "helpers" in their community, including first responders and service organizations. APT hosts these free family events in partnership with Fred Rogers Productions, PNC Bank, and Blue Cross Blue Shield of Alabama. This year, we were excited to host *Be My Neighbor Day* at Landmark Park in Dothan, Alabama. We had a total of 1,200 guests in attendance, including over 100 volunteers. Along with other activities, event attendees packed art bags, health clinic bags, and bags for senior citizens. Each of those bags was distributed among the community. We also donated hundreds of sweaters to a local organization, Helping Hands.

SUPPORTING TEACHERS

APT CERTIFIED EDUCATOR PROGRAM

Launched in 2023, APT Educational Services' "K-12 APT Certified Educator" program is a three-tier initiative designed to engage certified educators in the state with APT and PBS Learning Media resources while demonstrating how to effectively use them in the classroom. To date, **224** educators have completed the course and earned professional development hours. These educators are now eligible to advance to Tier 2, the "K-12 APT Ambassador" program, which provides teachers with the tools to mentor their peers and promote APT's educational services within their schools and communities.



APT EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION AWARD

APT Educational Services celebrated its **second year** of the *Teacher of the Month* program to recognize outstanding educators. The program invites nominations for teachers serving kindergarten through 12th grade. Each month, a committee reviews the nominations and selects one teacher to receive \$500, which can be used for professional development, student field trips, or classroom resources. This initiative aims to celebrate and support teachers in their ongoing efforts to inspire and educate students.



FUND FOR TEACHERS

Fund for Teachers enhances instruction by investing in the self-determined professional growth and development of outstanding educators, supporting student success, enriching teaching practices, and strengthening schools and communities. In 2024, ten educators in Alabama were awarded professional development opportunities through the Fund for Teachers Professional Development Grant. The awarded proposals, totaling \$44,500, included opportunities to study in locations such as Belize, Japan, London, Hawaii, Milan, and Greece. APT is proud to partner with this national program. Since 2012, nearly 140 teachers in Alabama have received this prestigious and highly competitive opportunity!

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

APT + STEM EDUCATION



Alabama Public Television's Educational Services Department recognizes the critical role STEM education plays in the lives of young students. Led by Education Specialist Tracey Carter, the *Alabama STEM Days for Teachers* initiative collaborates with local and statewide partners to ensure that students have access to top-tier resources and that educators are equipped to effectively incorporate these resources into the classroom.

In June, the Alabama Nature Center in Millbrook hosted over **65** Alabama educators for a day of learning and collaboration. APT Education partnered with the Alabama Nature Center, Alabama Technology in Motion, Alabama Learning Exchange, Legacy Environmental Partners in Education, and EdFarm to provide valuable resources, facilitate workshops, and offer environmental tours.

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The Second STEM Day took place in November at The Pelican's Nest Science Lab in Fairhope, Alabama, where **20** teachers from 19 different schools participated in hands-on activities focused on Mobile Bay. Mobile Baykeeper shared insights into the Bay's significance to Alabama, while APT led a session on "eco media literacy" and offered participants opportunities to create and engage with media.

Throughout the year, APT also offered multiple virtual STEM-based professional development sessions for teachers.

EARLY CHILDHOOD MATH

Alabama's Early Childhood Education department also recognizes the importance of STEM education in early development. As part of this effort, APT Early Childhood offers family and caregiver workshops to support learning.

In 2024, APT Early Childhood took part in the Family Math Program, a research-driven, multiplatform initiative designed to foster math positivity, build confidence, and enhance foundational math skills for families with children ages 2–5. This program equips parents and caregivers with effective strategies and resources to create engaging, math-rich experiences at home through playful learning and hands-on activities.

It highlights how math can be simple, enjoyable, and integrated into daily life. APT Early Childhood hosted 4 workshops for families this year, with 94 caregivers and 92 children taking part.

The Ready-to-Learn initiative partnered with Parnell Memorial Library in Montevallo, Alabama to host a **Peg+Cat** camp. Designed for children entering kindergarten and first grade, the camp focused on foundational math concepts such as counting, sorting, patterns, and spatial relationships. **Eighteen** students and their families had the opportunity to strengthen essential math skills while receiving free resources.

Throughout the year, APT also offered multiple virtual STEM-based professional development sessions for teachers.

EDUCATOR TRAINING

APT's Early Childhood Education team provides online and face-to-face training for childcare providers throughout Alabama. Participation in online-facilitated courses decreased in 2024 as participation in on-demand courses continue to increase as more educators learned about the programs.

DEFENDING FREEDOM:THE ARTHUR SHORES STORY

In partnership with JSU and Longleaf Studios, APT presented a free premiere screening of the JSU documentary **Defending Freedom: The Arthur Shores Story** the week before its broadcast premiere in February at the historic Carver Theatre in downtown Birmingham. The Carver was packed to capacity by people eager to see the film and hear from Arthur Shores daughter, Barbara Shores, retired judge Houston Brown and other speakers. Birmingham mayor Randall Woodfin was among the distinguished guests.

FINDING YOUR ROOTS: VIEWERS LIKE YOU

The long-running PBS series **FINDING YOUR ROOTS** did something new in 2024, creating an episode featuring ordinary non-celebrity viewers selected from a nationwide submission campaign. Birmingham-area resident Terrie Morrow was one of the three lucky people selected and the episode broadcast in April. With a grant provided by **FINDING YOUR ROOTS**, APT held a special preview event for the episode with Terrie as the guest of honor and many of her extended family attended.

GREAT ALABAMA PUBLIC TELEVISION BARBECUE COOK-OFF

Alabama Public Television is a vital part of Alabama's public safety infrastructure.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Today's Alabama Public Television's 2,200-mile microwave **network** is the backbone of Alabama's Emergency Alert System (EAS), distributing national, state and local emergency broadcast signals to all radio and television broadcasters throughout the state. APT is also the hub for Alabama's Amber Alert system to track missing children, and WARN system notifications for cell phones. APT's microwave system provides extensive communication services for Homeland Security, the Alabama Department of Public Safety, State Capitol Police and 68 E911 centers throughout the state. A microwave connection to the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) bunker in Clanton provides constant communications with the ability to disseminate emergency messages, as well as live video/audio broadcasts directly from the SEOC bunker, to 99% of TV households in the state of Alabama, as well as nationally from APT's satellite uplink center in Montgomery.



In May 2024, APT was awarded a **Next Generation Warning System (NGWS)** grant from the Corporation for Public
Broadcasting (CPB) to upgrade equipment to provide enhanced emergency alerting. Funded by the Federal Emergency
Management Agency (FEMA), APT will receive funds to purchase hardware and software that will allow the network to transition to the ATSC 3.0 broadcast standard. The upgrade to Next Gen TV will enable the network to broadcast emergency alerts, (including live video), to targeted devices.
